REQUIREMENTS

According to the [CEC Screening Policy](#), the Chief Routesetter and the Assistant Chief Routesetter positions are ranked “Level 2 - Medium Risk” positions. Therefore, the following requirements must be completed prior to performing the duties at the event:

1. Have a valid CEC License
2. Complete the online CEC Volunteer Registration Form when requested by CEC
3. Provide an Enhanced Police Information Check (E-PIC) when invited to do so by CEC
4. Safe Sport & Ethics Training

1. Knowledge of the current IFSC rules and regulations
2. Potential for growth as a routesetter
3. Ability to mentor apprentice future head routesetters during the event
4. Canadian Resident or Citizen, located in Canada
5. Proximity to the event host facility
