REQUIREMENTS

According to the [CEC Screening Policy](#), the Routesetter positions are ranked “Level 2 - Medium Risk” positions. Therefore, the following requirements must be completed prior to performing the duties at the event:

1. Have a valid [2021-2022 CEC License](#) (athlete, coach, or officials license)
2. Complete the online CEC Volunteer Registration Form when requested by CEC
3. Provide an Enhanced Police Information Check (E-PIC) when invited to do so by CEC
4. Safe Sport & Ethics Training

 - b. [CAC Safe Sport Training](#)
5. Concussion Awareness training - [Making Head Way in Sport](#)
6. Return a signed copy of the [CEC Concussion Pre-Season Education Sheet](#)
7. Read and remain up to date on all CEC and IFSC rules and regulations.

JOB DESCRIPTION

The Routesetter is responsible for:

- Following the direction of the Head and Assistant Head Routesetters
- Set the problems or routes for the competition
- Forerun routes
- In some cases, produce beta videos to post on the CEC YouTube Channel

EXPERIENCE AND SKILLS

Successful candidates will have the following experience and skills:

- Previous experience as competition setter at a Provincial or higher competition level
- Ability to work with a group in a high-pressure environment
- Ability to follow directions
- Other national accreditation (USAC) (considered a bonus)

SELECTION PROCESS

The selection committee for Routesetting positions for the CEC Senior events is as follows:

- CEC Coordinator - Sebastian Powell
- CEC High Performance Director - Andrew Wilson
- Representative from host facility
- Head and Assistant Head Routesetters for the event

The selection committee will review all applications using the following criteria in order of importance:

First Priority Criteria

1. Potential for growth into the role of Assistant Head Routesetter in the near future
2. Setting experiences in the discipline being applied for
 - a. 4 setting experiences as a full setter at a Provincial or higher competition level
 - b. Setting experiences as Head or Assistant Routesetter for a provincial level event is an asset
3. Other competition experience, setting and competing

Second Priority Criteria

1. Knowledge of the current IFSC rules and regulations
2. Potential for growth as a Routesetter
3. Proximity to the event host facility
4. Add diversity to the setting crew
